Physicians seeking CME credits related to the NABBLM Board exam should refer to NABBLM's <u>website</u> (https://nabblm.org/) which sets out that the breastfeeding and lactation medicine knowledge requirements to sit for the grandparenting Board exam in 2025 includes 45 CME credits related to lactation over the past 3 years. The CMEs must be taught by physicians or PhD researchers who are knowledgeable about lactation. A CME certificate must have been obtained.
